Nanci Murphy, President, called the meeting to order at 7:02pm.

The minutes from the last meeting were attached to the email reminder of this meeting. Nanci asked if there were any comments or corrections. There were no changes so the minutes stand approved as submitted.

Update on the state of the library: Given by Courtney.

- Tile guy is re-tiling the public bathrooms
- Walls are intact now, still painting
- Waiting on rug
- Waiting on status of front doors
- Nanci and Stephanie have been bringing in books from the shed may come in again this weekend
- Thinking about Jim James a lot of the books were children's books from the shed
- Inspector hasn't come to approve anything yet so people can't really come in much to the workspace

Treasurer's report: Given by Susan.

- \$73,000 in all 3 accounts including money market
- Checking account is getting down there less than \$7,000 so good timing for memberships to come in
- Amazon smile is going away now they are doing their own programs. They will give us some more money as a send off
- We can set up a wish list on Amazon so people can purchase us things we would like/need from Amazon (e.g., Lysol wipes, envelopes, paper, etc.) – think about what we may want to include on such a list
- Foxboro Federal merged with Norwood Bank now is called One Local. Jim is still there
- Newsletter about 800 people on the list

 Michelle processed \$1100 and some change and a couple hundred dollars of something else – she has been checking for envelopes.

Trustees report: Given by Patti.

- Meeting was January 23rd in person at Norfolk Town Hall. Harry in attendance for friends.
- Library has been closed trying to keep open as much as possible. Reopening plan in the works.
- FY24 budget conversations
- Policies approved governance and leadership, Norfolk local history, collection policy, others
- Brought up by Patti at the Trustees meeting collection bins at transfer station wondering what impact is of having town designation on bin for book donations and how it affects Friends collection in the books shed. Does the public realize that the library doesn't get those books? Company that has town bin picks up books from people's homes. Best books should go into the shed, anything without great resale should go into other bins. Nanci said the town promised to send out a notice, but we have not seen it. Nanci called the company to see if they were going to pick up books for us. It has been 3 days with no response. Nanci is following up with DPW and company too. Courtney will put something in library newsletter, and something in ours too.

 - Tech 911 new series new device or any questions on online world can have 1 on 1 help starting in March
